


LIVING NEAR LEAD

Lead is a naturally occurring metal found in small amounts in the earth's crust.






How are people exposed to lead?




How is health affected?

Communities AAAA

Low income people of color, Older homes with lead paint, Homes near lead industries

<80 ppm residential "safe" (State of CA)

> 400 ppm priority clean-up

Understanding lead levels

Soil

ppm = parts per million

Teeth

can provide information on lead levels during pregnancy & early childhood



Elevated

Blood

> 5 ug/dl



> 1000 ppm immediate cleanup

Exide

battery recycling plant - lead smelter

- Released massive amounts of lead, arsenic and other toxins into the community
- Contaminated soil in schools, parks and homes
- A comprehensive clean-up of contaminated soil will prevent future lead exposure
